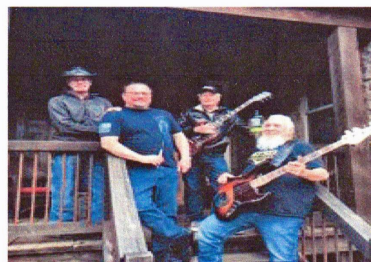

Presidents' Corner ~ by Sherry Spooner

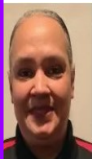

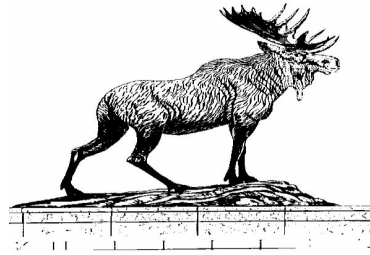
