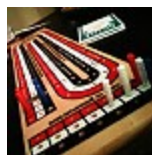

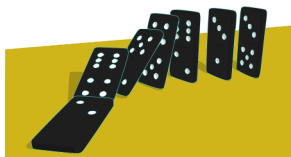

HERE ARE SOME HELPFUL GARDENING TIPS FOR MARCH,

All Regions:

Soil Testing: Send a soil sample to your local county extension service office for testing. This analysis will guide you on any necessary soil amendments.

Avoid Compaction: Refrain from walking across your garden when the soil is wet to prevent compaction.

Start a Garden Journal: Consider keeping a garden journal to systematically improve your garden over the years.

Northeast:

Pruning and Grasses: Similar to the Midwest, prune shrubs and trim ornamental grass stalks.

Fruit Trees: Spray fruit trees.

Remove Burlap: If you protected evergreens with burlap during winter, remove it now.

Mulch Management: Check on garden mulch. Adjust based on frost heaves and early spring growth.

Pacific Northwest:

Apply Compost: Add compost to the soil.

Plant Summer Bulbs: Get those summer bulbs in the ground.

Peas: Plant peas (late March).

Deadhead Early Bloomers: Remove spent blooms.

Slug Control: Keep an eye on slugs.

Rose Care: Prune and fertilize rose bushes.

Apple Trees: Hang maggot traps to protect apple trees.

Alaska:

Rhubarb Check: See if rhubarb has emerged.

Pacific Coast (Northern California):

Planting Time: Enjoy the mild climate and plant potatoes, root vegetables, and summer flowers and herbs.

Pruning: Prune roses and other shrubs before new growth appears.

Perennial Beds: Clean up perennial beds and divide overcrowded plants 123.

Remember, gardening is both science and art, so adapt these tips to your specific conditions and preferences. Happy gardening!

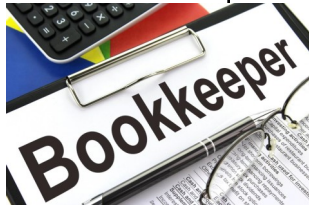
